TRUSTING IN THE PROMISES OF GOD

My Soul Is at Rest

(Psalm 62)

My soul is at rest in God a-lone; my sal-va-tion comes from God.

PSALM 62

Refrain

- 1 For God alone my soul in silence waits; from God comes my salvation.
- 2 God alone is my rock and my salvation, my stronghold, so that I shall not be greatly shaken. Refrain
- 3 How long will you assail me to crush me, all of you together, as you would a leaning fence, a toppling wall?
- 4 They seek only to bring me down from my place of honor; lies are their chief delight.

They bless with their lips, but in their hearts they curse. *Refrain*

- 5 For God alone my soul in silence waits; truly, my hope is in God.
- 6 God alone is my rock and my salvation, my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.
- 7 In God is my safety and my honor; God is my strong rock and my refuge. Refrain
- 8 Put your trust in God always, O people; pour out your hearts before God, who is our refuge.
- 9 Those of high degree are but a fleeting breath; even those of low estate cannot be trusted.

On the scales they are lighter than a breath, all of them together.

- 10 Put no trust in extortion; in robbery take no empty pride; though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it. Refrain

This briefer version of a refrain based on Psalm 62:1, 5 (compare with no. 814) also comes from the ecumenical community at Taizé, France. It can be used alone for repeated singing or as a prayer response, but it appears here as a refrain that ties together the entire psalm.
